Trail of Tears to be SCHHS first program of 2017

The Saline County History & Heritage Society has scheduled Amy McMillan of the Department of Arkansas Historic Preservation to present the first program of 2017. Her presentation will be on

the Trail of Tears. Saline County and Benton were involved in the Trail of Tears with the Choctaws and Chickasaws who travelled down the Military Road in the 1830's moving into Indian Territory. William Lockhert who operated a ferry on the Saline River sold supplies to the government for those travelling on the trail through Benton. Check out the historic marker in Randy Mooney park on Main Street.

End of Year Dinner for 2016 ended with around 25 in attendance.

The Saline County History & Heritage Society held its annual end of year dinner for 2016 with 25 in attendance at the meeting.

Camden Expedition Scenic Trail committee coming to Benton on Monday February 13th

The Arkansas Department of Historic Preservation has formed a committee of representatives from Saline, Grant, Hot Spring, Clark, Cleveland, Ouachita and Nevada counties to develop a map of places to see in each county that are related to the ill fated Camden Expedition of the Red River Campaign of Union Troops in 1864 during the Civil War. This committee started out in 2015 in Clark County in Arkadelphia and then went to Hot Spring county

and Malvern, next came Sheridan and Grant county and Jenkins Ferry, Cleveland County Marks Mill, Ouachita County and Poison Springs and Camden, Nevada county, Praire De Ann, Elkins Ferry, and Moscow church. Benton will be the seventh stop on the tour. The committee will check out the Lenz house, Col. Crawford tomb, the Shoppach house, and the Saline River (weather permitting). As President of SCHHS, I was invited to serve on the committee from Sa-

line County. The last meeting of the committee will be held at McArthur Park in Little Rock. It is the purpose of the committee to develop a map of civil war sites in these counties to encourage Civil War tourism.

She attended the National Institute on Genealogical Research (NIGR) at the National Archives in Washington, D.C., and completed Elizabeth Shown Mills' course in Advanced Methodology and Evidence Analysis and Thomas W. Jones' course in Writing and Publishing for Genealogists at the Institute of Genealogy & Historical Research (IGHR) at Samford University. I'm privileged now to serve on the faculty at IGHR, at the Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy (SLIG), at the Genealogical Research Institute of Pittsburgh (GRIP), and at Boston University's Center for Professional Education.
