The 1918 Flu Epidemic in Saline County, Arkansas

He also helped to get the Encyclopedia of Arkansas online. Tim has also served as President of the Arkansas Historical Association and has worked in preserving Arkansas History for many years. He is originally from Perry county, Arkansas. He is a graduate of the University of

Central Arkansas with a BA in History and he received a Masters in Library Science from the University of Oklahoma with a specialty in Archival management. He is a certified Archivist and enjoys Arkansas History.

Arkansas State Historian speaks to SCHHS in September

In September, Dr. Wendy Richter, the new Arkansas State Historian, spoke to the Saline County History & Heritage Society on her plans for the Arkansas State Archives. Dr. Richter who had previously served as state historian, had only recently served as the Ouachita Baptist University archives and special collections director.

A large crowd attended the very informative presentation.

Dr. Richter originally from Hot Springs has worked with the Saline County Hitory & Heritage Society many times on projects. In 2001, she served as program chairman for the 60th annual meeting of the Arkansas Historical Association which was held in Benton, Arkansas and was sponsored by the Saline County History & Heritage Society.

Dr. Richter was responsible for cataloging the Senator John L. McClellan collection which is housed at Ouachita Baptist University and also the papers of former Governor Mike Huckabee.

Dr. Richter has also presented many previous programs to the Saline County History & Heritage Society and we appreciate her service to our society.





Archival Supplies arrive at SCHHS after Successful Grant

Back in April, Steve Perdue, 2nd Vice President of the Saline County History & Heritage Society submitted a grant for archival supplies from the Department of Arkansas Heritage Small Museum grant program. In May, it was announced that Steve was successful and the grant was awarded to the society. In June, the supplies covered the floor of the society as the boxes were unwrapped and checked off the lists. Librarian Pauline Brown, Robert Edwards, and Carolyn Wise started using the much needed supplies as they arrived.

This will enable researchers to find collections housed in acid free boxes and folders in future years.
